



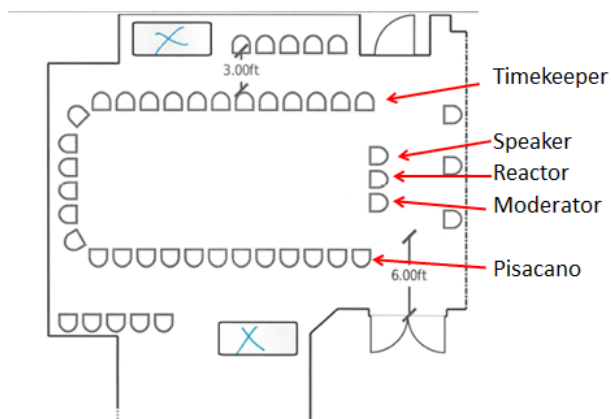

### Moderator/Reporter & Pisacano Scholar Guide – World Café & Reporting Out

- 1) As soon as TED Talks finish, move immediately to your assigned room (see below), and ask folks to find a seat as soon as they come in. Make sure all are in the ‘U-shaped’ area. We have broken participants up into small groups, and anticipate 25-35 persons at any given half-day (some can’t attend the whole conference while others may have to step out).
- 2) Recruit a Notetaker to stand at the Easel and capture group thoughts – these are Sticky wallboards and the paper can be stuck to the Breakout room walls once a page is full... that group will gradually fill their walls over the two day conference with ideas

#### BREAKOUT ROOM LAYOUT:



You'll sit in front (at top of the U)

Extra seats are at the sides of the room are there in case a group exceeds the planned capacity of the U-shaped area in that room (and for staff/hosts)

If needed, ask that participant to pull their chair into the group so everyone is included in the conversation

- 3) Call group to order & remind participants to put cell phones on silent and close laptops.
- 4) To maximize discussion time, we suggest you offer only a brief introduction. Here is suggested intro language for you to adapt:

*“I’m [NAME], and we’re here to gather your thoughts and input regarding the big ideas that [YOUR SPEAKER]’s introduced earlier. I’ll be moderating this 20 minute discussion, [PISACANO] will be taking notes and helping me to organize our report back to all participants, and [TIMEKEEPER] will keep us on schedule so that we can offer fair time for discussion of all four TED talks. But first, [REACTOR], who is [1-2 SENTENCE BIO] will offer a 3 minute reaction to [SPEAKER]’s talk to get us started*

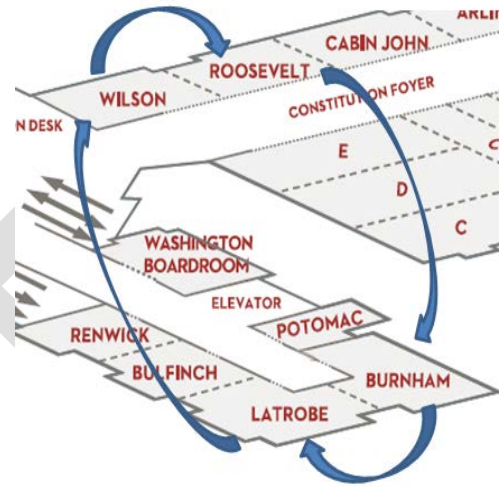
- 5) After the Reactor speaks, you will help to facilitate the discussion, guided by the questions on the Issue Brief created for your Speaker’s TED talk.

- 6) At the end of each 20 minute discussion, a bell will ring in the hallway, and your timekeeper will signal you to wrap up the discussion. Your timekeeper will then escort you, the Pisacano scholar, the Reactor, and the Speaker to the next breakout room in **CLOCKWISE** order.

- 7) Rinse, repeat x 4 rounds of discussion (one for each TED Talk)

- 8) After four rounds of discussion, the participants will break for 15 minutes. Please **return immediately to the front right of the main conference room** where Ted Long will be waiting at a computer. Be prepared to contribute 3-4 bullet points representing main ideas/themes that emerged from the four rounds of discussion on your topic area.

- 9) Ted will type these directly into a formatted PowerPoint presentation so that we can display the PowerPoint during the Reporting/Reaction session.
- 10) When the group reconvenes, each Moderator/Reporter will be given 3 minutes to report on what transpired in their discussions, hopefully centered on those 3-4 themes. The participants will get 15 minutes to react, comment or ask clarifying questions.
